

Invitation to the 9th FSS Security Talk

Dear Sir or Madam,

The study "Security in a connected world" (2019) by PwC Switzerland has shown that there is a tension between federalism and centralization. On the one hand, federal police structures favor community policing and police work adapted to the needs of society. On the other hand, there is a call for greater centralization of cyber and data competencies to address the ever-increasing cyber threats.

Against this background, there are key questions regarding the current situation as well as the future design of Switzerland's internal security:

- How do societal changes affect the work of security forces?
- What are the greatest threats to public and private security?
- What opportunities and risks do new technologies and data analyses bring for police work?
- How should competencies in the security field be organized between state and private actors and between the different levels of government?

At the 9th FSS Security Talk "Security Forces in a Modern State" on October 27, 2021 at the Hotel Bellevue Palace in Bern, experts from academia, the police and the private sector will discuss these and other questions.


